Reader David writes about this excellent tip on the phone's anonymity: I needed to call someone in my cell, but I didn't want them to get my number on their caller ID. I know to use *67 at home if I want to do this, but selecting cells is different – you can't have that double dial tone to let you know that you are now limiting your number. On your cell phone, just start the number you call *67, as if the phone number starts with those three digits. It is important to remember that you need to put 1 before the area code, when cells usually do not need 1. For example, enter * 671917551212 before hitting the talk button leading the receivers to the caller ID to read limited. On my phone, the caller ID appears using this method private call.
